OUR HISTORY

The seeds of the Ladies of Charity were planted by Saint Vincent de Paul over 400 years ago in 1617 at Chatillon-les-Dombes in the mountainous region of eastern France.

With the assistance of Saint
Louise de Marillac, the
seeds germinated and took
root in the French
countryside and then
throughout the world.

In 1857, the first Ladies of Charity association was formed in the United States to continue the work of Vincent and Louise.

The number of associations grew, and in 1960 a national organization was formed for consistency and to strengthen the bonds of charity.
