SEEKING CHRIST TOGETHER

Life at St. Francis Xavier is rooted in a shared desire to seek Christ together through worship, learning and service.

Centered on the Eucharist and guided by the Holy Spirit, our parish forms disciples of all ages and reaches out in love to serve others. Serving both English and Spanish-speaking communities, we support a wide range of ministries in a parish that is active, welcoming and grounded in faith, where relationships grow and stewardship is lived each day.

A Legacy of Faith and Growth

Founded in 1953, St. Francis Xavier has grown from a small community of families into one of the most active parishes in the diocese. Over the decades, new buildings have been added as ministries expanded, allowing the parish to respond to changing needs. Today, as our parish continues to flourish, we are once again called to invest thoughtfully in the spaces that support our mission and ensure they serve future generations well.



Our Challenge

As St. Francis Xavier grows and thrives, the facilities that support our mission have not kept pace. While parish life is strong, many of our buildings are outdated and spread across campus, making them harder to use safely, comfortably and efficiently. Limited accessibility and aging infrastructure make it more difficult to serve our parish community well. To build on our strong foundation, we are called to invest now so our campus can fully support our mission for generations to come.

Our Master Plan

Following careful facility studies and extensive input from parishioners and staff, St. Francis Xavier developed a comprehensive, three-phase campus master plan. This plan is intentionally phased, allowing us to address our most urgent needs while maintaining a clear vision for long-term growth. **Phase 1 is our immediate priority** – the work that lays the foundation for everything that follows.

PHASE 1 | \$14 MILLION

First, we will focus on creating safer, more connected and more functional spaces that support education, faith formation and parish life today and into the future.

Expand the Educational Building

The Educational Building, built in 1954, is the parish's oldest building and one of its most far-reaching ministry spaces, serving Catholic school students, PSR families, Nazareth House ministries and more. Expanding this building will strengthen education and discipleship across the parish. The addition – approximately 17,400 square feet over two levels – will include:

- New classrooms for religious education, catechesis and middle school grades.
- A large library and computer lab.
- Small-group and collaborative learning spaces.
- An elevator and ADA-accessible restrooms on both levels, which will enable the facilities to be fully ADA accessible.
- Enclosed connections between the Parish Hall and Educational Building to improve campus flow and eliminate the need to go outside for gym and assemblies.
- A designated storm shelter for severe weather.





Parish Hall

Renovate the Parish Hall

The Parish Hall, built in 1986, is one of the most-used gathering spaces on campus, hosting funeral and wedding receptions, faith formation classes, retreats and parish-wide events. We will refresh the space, improve accessibility and ensure that it remains functional and inviting. Renovations will include:

- Expanded and renovated restrooms.
- An updated kitchen with new finishes and modern appliances.
- New audio/visual systems.
- Replacement of aging HVAC equipment.
- Improved storage for tables and chairs.
- Refreshed ceilings, walls and interior finishes.

Looking Ahead: Future Phases

While Phase 1 is our immediate focus, the master plan includes additional phases to be completed as resources and funding allow.

PHASE 2 | \$10.2 MILLION

We will build on Phase 1 by connecting the Educational Building to the Annex with a two-story, 6,400-square-foot addition and further improving campus safety, accessibility and functionality. This phase will focus especially on creating a secure entryway and administrative office area, along with targeted renovations to the existing Educational Building. Planned projects include:

- Targeted renovations to existing Educational Building areas not addressed in Phase 1.
- A new secure entryway to improve campus safety and visitor access.
- New administrative offices near the secure entryway.
- An additional elevator and a new stairwell to improve accessibility and circulation.
- ADA-accessible restrooms on each level.



PHASE 3 | \$4.6 MILLION

In the third and final phase, we will focus on updating and enhancing the Annex, which served as the original sanctuary. Planned improvements include:

- Renovation of Annex to a Multipurpose Hall.
- Restoring the vaulted ceiling and upgrading restrooms and kitchen.

OTHER PROJECTS | \$1.5 MILLION

These necessary improvements will be incorporated into the phases in a way that makes sense financially and logistically.

- Rectory Egress Stair Replacement.
- Improvements to the Athletic Fields.
